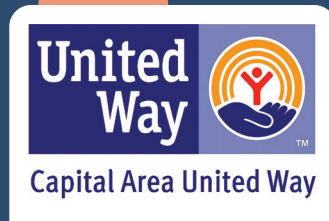

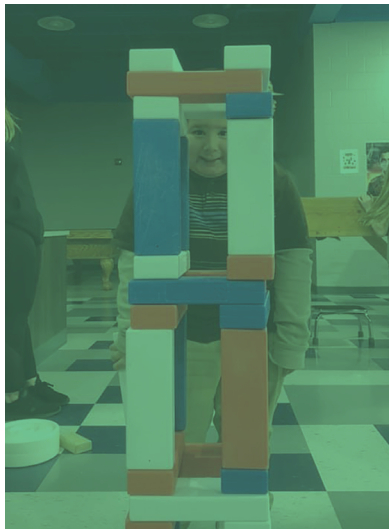

No one could have known how important being prepared for the challenges that life threw at society last year would become. Everyone was forced to step out of their comfort zones to live with any sort of normalcy.

Capital area Boy Scouts of America youth and leaders met and exceeded their “Be Prepared” motto in maintaining Scout programming and service to the community. Local Cub Scout Packs and Troops adapted to every situation tossed their way and succeeded. A few of these adaptations included everything from when and how to have meetings, to family-based virtual Cub activities, virtual Merit Badge sessions for Scouts BSA members, socially distanced outdoor camping opportunities, and Scouting for Food drives. With a big dose of the Cub Scout Motto “Do Your Best” at the forefront of every effort, local Scouting continued to deliver on its mission of character education, citizenship training, and physical fitness, despite all obstacles.

Often, many of these educational and community service opportunities are accomplished in our community even when local citizens are not aware of the Scouting connections. In 2020, Pierre area Scouts spent many hours helping out from painting the crosses for the cemetery, to helping construct a new shed at the cemetery, building memorial benches for area churches, building and painting signs for Game, Fish, and Parks, as well as helping assemble over 30,000 COVID test kits that were distributed throughout the state of South Dakota. And, the list could go on.

CAPITAL AREA COUNSELING SERVICES, TEEN COURT

Without CAUW, Teen Court would not be possible. Many of our regular funding sources have decreased their donations in the last year and a half, so CAUW is our main source of funding. Because of CAUW, we have been able to add new courses to our program for teens to take while they are going through our program. These programs are designed to assist teens with drug and alcohol education and prevention, as well as responsible thinking and moral decision making. Funding has also helped us create incentives for our teen volunteers, which helps them stay engaged in the program, especially when it is difficult (such as right now, being virtual). Not only does Teen Court help give youth a second chance, often times it helps with early-interventions of mental health issues as we are able to identify each defendant's unique needs and support them in getting set up with appropriate services for them. In this way, the program benefits the entire community. For that, we are so thankful to CAUW!

Avera St. Mary's Central SD Child Assessment Center provides medical evaluations to children of alleged abuse. Due to the support from Capital Area United Way, services are provided to every child regardless of ability to pay. Children are evaluated for child physical abuse, neglect, child sexual abuse, drug endangerment, or witness to violence or other crimes. The Children's Advocacy Center model ensures that Law Enforcement, Child Protection Services, mental health professionals, victim advocates, medical professionals, and prosecutors collaborate together for the benefit of the child and family.

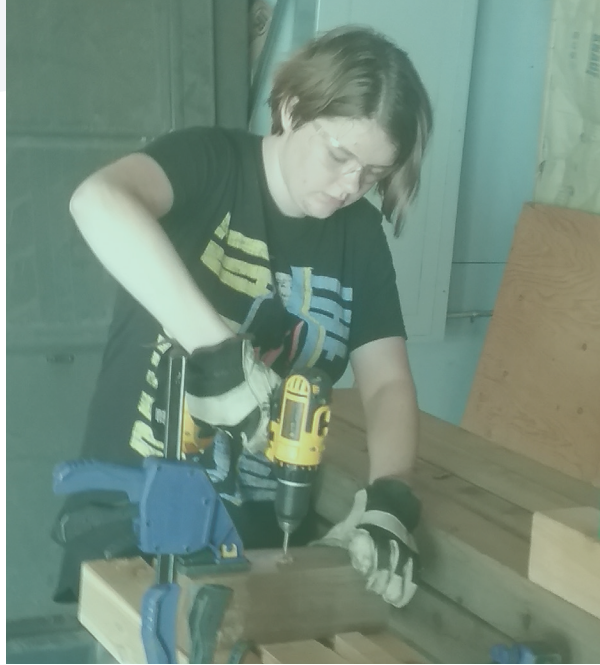


CENTRAL SD RSVP

GIRL SCOUTS, DAKOTA HORIZON COUNCIL

United Way funding is fueling the next generation of leaders in the workplace and community as girls of all ages embark on the Girl Scout Leadership Experience program. Their journey of discovery begins in kindergarten and continues until they graduate from high school. Girl Scouts, like Anya Jones in Pierre, not only learn skills they will use throughout their lifetime but also take action to improve their community.

In this photo, Anya is learning how to safely work with power tools on a project to add a group seating area at the Oahe Downstream cabin used by Girl Scouts and others for outdoor gatherings. The project spanned nine months and took nearly 100 hours of work as Anya designed, fundraised, and built nine benches.

As a result of her leadership in successfully completing this project, the Pierre Girl Scout earned the highest honor in Girl Scouts, namely the Gold Award. Her hard work is an inspiration to all of our Girl Scouts in the Pierre/Fort Pierre area.

If it's learning carpentry skills or how to build a campfire, Girl Scouts are discovering their talents every day thanks to the support of scholarships and programs made possible by United Way funding. COMMUNITY & YOUTH INVOLVED CENTER

The Community & Youth Involved, Inc. (CYI) is proud and thankful to be a Capital Area United Way Partner Agency. CYI is a true “community center” for our cities and counties. Year-round senior meals and out-of-school-time care for children, The GOLD Program, are our primary activities. However, the facility is rarely empty. In the evening, sports teams and community organizations often gather here. Nearly every weekend CYI is used for community events, weddings, auctions, and more. It serves as a polling place for elections.

With the support of United Way, the Senior Meal program prepared and delivered 30,000 meals in 2020. Even through the challenges of COVID, staff and volunteers did not miss a day of service to home-bound seniors.

Over seventy k-14 children participate in CYI's Greater Opportunities for Learning & Development (GOLD) Afterschool and Summer Program. United Way funding helps provide meals, supplies, and a clean safe place for these children while their parents work. GOLDkids participate in activities to improve academic performance and their physical, social, and emotional well-being.

During COVID and over many years, CYI has been an organization that sees and fills needs in our community. As always, in 2020, United Way made these services possible.

GROWING UP TOGETHER

The funding received from the Capital Area United Way allows Growing Up Together to meet our Mission of Providing Quality Prenatal and Parenting Education and Support. Services include bi-monthly childbirth and breastfeeding classes. New moms are able to contact our Certified Lactation Counselors, free of charge, to receive assistance with breastfeeding questions and ongoing support during their breastfeeding journey through participation in support group meetings. Funding also assists us in providing a 6-week Parenting Class, free of charge, in the community 4 times per year and at the Women's Prison. This program helps diminish yelling and promotes good behavior. We provide specialized services for young families, connecting them to the appropriate resources in the community and providing support to help them reach their educational and financial goals. Growing Up Together is very grateful for the funding received from the Capital Area United Way. We would not be able to meet our goals and fulfill our Mission without them!

MISSOURI SHORES DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CENTER

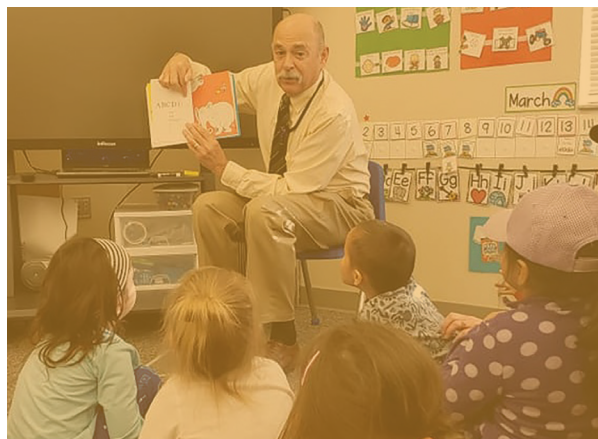
